

1 Gaba Teahouse, Canggu

A small Chinese-style teahouse with a beautifully designed interior. Guests can order tea in three different ways—simple cup, European-style brew, or the full gong fu cha experience (200K IDR / ~€10). With more than 50 teas all priced equally, you're free to choose widely. We opted for a special Oolong that held up through more than ten infusions. Takeaway teas are packed in small vacuum bags (40–60K IDR), perfect for sampling a wide variety. Staff knowledge was limited, but brewing at the ceremonial master table (usually reserved for rituals) made this a memorable stop.

2 Rusters, Ubud

Tucked away behind Rusters' pottery studio, bakery, and coffeehouse lies a serene Japanese-inspired teahouse. The menu is beautifully curated, offering a wide range of choices. We tried Jasmine, Oolong, and Puer, each served with a full gong fu set for self-brewing (~100K IDR per tea). The staff were both kind and knowledgeable, and despite being busy, the space retained a tranquil vibe. Perhaps the best teahouse experience in Ubud.

3 Chai Chitai (Shisha & Tea), Canggu

A quirky mix of teahouse in the front and shisha lounge in the back. You can choose how your tea is served: a single large cup, European-style (3g), or gong fu style (8g). We chose gong fu (~100K IDR) and sampled a White tea and two Puers—one with an unexpectedly marine, oyster-like note. The variety of serving styles and easygoing atmosphere make this an unusual but rewarding stop.

4 Chontea, Canggu

A Japanese-style teahouse hidden on the first floor above a busy road. While the focus is on Matcha, they also serve other teas. Seated at the counter, we enjoyed a Puer (~100K IDR), brewed up to five times by the host. Calm ambiance, friendly staff, and fair prices for the quality make this a comfortable and relaxing stop.

5 Bokashi, Pererenan, Canggu

Not a traditional teahouse but a healthy café and eco-conscious shop—and importantly, the first and one of the only places in Bali where we found a wide variety of local Indonesian teas. Their selection includes green, white, black, and oolong, many from small producers. A smoky Dark Oolong stood out, while a Golden Yellow was more subtle. Drink-in prices are a steal (40–60K IDR), though packaged teas run around 100K per 10g. The matcha tiramisu is also highly recommended.

6 Chontea, Ubud

Chontea operates two tea houses here: one dedicated to ceremonial and tasting experiences (opened 2024), and another café-style location (opened 2025). We visited the café version, surrounded by rice fields. A loose-leaf Hojicha (~100K IDR) came with a thermos of hot water and a small guide for self-brewing. Staff are knowledgeable and welcoming. The ceremonial house, not yet visited, offers guided tastings—such as multi-brew Matcha flights with detailed storytelling.

7 Panda Tea, Ubud

A small Chinese-style teahouse with an impressive menu of around 100 teas. Guests can choose serving style (small pot 5g, large pot 10g, standard or premium leaf), with prices ranging from 150K to 500K IDR. We enjoyed a high-quality Oolong at the lower end. The vibe is unique: house music plays from a DJ booth—fun for some, jarring for those seeking traditional tranquility.

8 Dragon Tea Temple, Ubud

One of the most beautiful interiors of any teahouse on the island. The setting is calm and meditative, with an extensive menu of ~40 teas (mainly Chinese, plus some local). Prices range from 100K to 400K IDR, and teas are served with a full gong fu set and a thermos for multiple rounds. We brewed a Java Dark Roast up to five times—a rich, satisfying experience. The second place in Bali where we found some local Indonesian teas.

9 Made Tea, Ubud

A relaxed garden teahouse perfect for escaping Ubud's busier streets. While they produce just one green and one black tea, their speciality is herbal infusions: visitors can pick fresh ingredients straight from the garden. We blended lemongrass, rose, and butterfly pea (~30K IDR) and sampled mulberries. Their shop also sells a variety of creative herbal blends.

10 D'Wan Tea at Jatiluwih Tabanan

A destination in itself: a stunning tea estate in the hills, producing black, white, green, and oolong teas. The views alone are worth the trip (about an hour by bike from Canggu), but sipping estate-grown tea where it's cultivated is unforgettable. We enjoyed a white tea (100K IDR), steeped four times. Scenic, serene, and highly recommended.
